CONFIRM YOUR STEP AND LANE

The first pay date for the 2018-19 school year is this Friday. September 14th. You should check your step and lane in your employee profile to confirm you are being paid at the correct rate.

To check your step and lane, navigate to the MPS public website and click "Careers" on the homepage, then select "Internal,"

at which point you'll need to log in.

After you log in, click the drop down arrow next to the word "HOME" and select "My Employee File."

Finally, select "Show More" at the bottom of your employee information. You will then see your step and lane listed.
